Opportunities for Business Visitors and Investors

#### **Quick Facts**

- Traditionally an immigration country
  - Commitment to receive over 330,000 immigrants every year for the next 3 years
- Canada offers temporary access through competitive programs
  - Over 500,000 international students
  - Over 200,000 temporary workers
  - Countless business visitors every year



## **Travelling to Canada for Business Purposes**

- Turkish business people travelling to Canada must apply for a business visa:
  - Apply at the Canada Visa Application Centre (VAC) in Istanbul or Ankara www.vfsglobal.ca/Canada/Turkey/;
  - ➤ Or apply online: <a href="http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/business.asp">http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/business.asp</a>
  - ➤ Biometrics is required \*
  - ➤ Visas are normally valid for multiple entries for 10 years or to the validity of your passport, whichever is shorter.
  - ➤ Provide a letter of invitation from the company in Canada and evidence of your business relationship to avoid delays.

# **Working in Canada**

- In most cases, a work permit and a Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA) is required to work in Canada.
- LMIA Exemptions International Mobility Program:
  - R204: International agreements
  - R205: Canadian interests
  - R207: Permanent residence applicants in Canada

# **Working in Canada**

- Intra-company Transferees: Companies with branches in Canada and Turkey can in some cases transfer staff to work in Canada with a work permit:
  - Currently employed by a multi-national company;
  - Seeking entry to work in a parent, a subsidiary, a branch, or an affiliate in Canada;
  - Being transferred to a position in an executive, senior managerial, or specialized knowledge capacity; and
  - In a similar full-time position at the current company for at least one year in the last three years.

# Global Mobility: Working in Canada

- Global Skills Strategy
  - A fast, and predictable way to get top talent to Canada quickly
    - Two week processing standard for work permit applications from outside of Canada in 80% of cases

- Benefits to families which offer attractive elements to recruit top talent
  - Open Work Permits for spouses of skilled workers and <u>study</u> <u>permits</u> for accompanying children means that family members have opportunities in Canada.
  - Family member applications <u>processed at the same time</u> as the skilled work permit application means that families can stay together.
- Programs which enable businesses to retain top talent
  - Pathways to <u>permanent residency</u>, and points awarded for work experience in Canada and rapid processing (6 months for 80% of applications

# **Living in Canada Permanently**

 For entrepreneurs and business people, there are several possibilities for immigration to Canada:

### **Express Entry**

- an online system that we use to manage applications for permanent residence from:

Federal Skilled Workers
Federal Skilled Trades
Provincial Nominees
Canadian Experience Class

# **Living in Canada Permanently**

#### Start-Up Visa

- Canada's Start-up Visa Program targets immigrant entrepreneurs with the skills and potential to build businesses in Canada that:
- are innovative
- can create jobs for Canadians
- can compete on a global scale
- To <u>apply for the Start-up Visa Program</u>, your business idea or venture must get the support of **one or more** of the designated organizations listed below:
- Venture capital funds; Investment of at least \$200,000
- Angel investor groups; Investment of at least \$75,000
- Business incubators

# **Living in Canada Permanently**

#### **Quebec Selected Skilled Workers / Investors**

- Quebec has a special agreement on immigration with the Government of Canada. The province has its own rules for choosing immigrants who will adapt well to living there.
- To immigrate to Canada as a Quebec-selected skilled worker or an investor, you must apply in the following 2 stages:
- Apply to the <u>Government of Quebec</u> for a Quebec Selection Certificate (Certificat de sélection du Québec [CSQ]).
  - The Province of Quebec will assess you, using its own rules.
  - The certificate shows that the Province of Quebec has accepted you as an immigrant.
- If the Province of Quebec chooses you and gives you a CSQ, you must apply to Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada for permanent residence.
